Merchant Navy Day has been celebrated on the 3rd September since 2000. Last year (2015) Seafarers UK, supported by the National Merchant Navy Association, campaigned for the Red



Ensign to be flown on public buildings and land mark flagstaffs across the U.K. A number of Welsh Councils supported this campaign including Cardiff and Caerphilly. We were invited to the Flag Raising at Cardiff Castle where our Chairman Harry Parry had the honour of raising the flag over the battlements. Dave Richards carried our Standard. Tony Meade and John Evans represented us at the Caerphilly Council Flag Raising at Ystrad Mynach where our Standard was carried by our colleague James Attenborough of the RNA. The Red Ensign was also flown from the flagstaffs of the Senedd at Cardiff Bay.

Our Service down the Bay in November marked the end of an era it being the last time that Canon Graham Francis would

officiated. He will be retiring before our service in May. #### SWANSEA M.N.A. WAR MEMORIAL

Public recognition has been given at last to 126 people who lost their lives serving their country at sea.

The missing names of those who fell have been added to the Swansea Merchant Navy Association memorial at SA1. They include 75 local seamen from World War One, two of which were aboard RMS Lusitania which was torpedoed by a German U-boat in 1915 and sank.

Another 126 names have been added on to the Merchant Navy Memorial at SA1 in Swansea, accessible via a mobile phone able to use a free QR-code scanner.

The Merchant Navy Association (Wales) has teamed up with information project HistoryPoints to make the names and personal details of thousands of merchant seamen who died in wartime available to the public on smartphones and tablet computers at memorials.

Smartphone and tablet owners need only a free QR-code scanner to access the information.

The additions to the Swansea memorial were made possible after dogged research by two stalwarts of the branch.

"Following on from the fantastic work done by the late Marjorie Thompson-Jones and her husband David in researching the names of casualties prior to the opening of the memorial in 2005, it has now been possible to add another 126 names, including 75 local seamen lost in World War One, two of these aboard the Lusitania," said branch vice chairman Ron Tovey.

"These additional names are available via a QR plaque at the SA1 memorial or at the HistoryPoints website. I would also like to thank Byron Jones, of MNA Wales, along with HistoryPoints for making this possible."

Byron Jones, secretary of the MNA (Wales), said: "We are delighted that this modern technology is allowing us to explain the sacrifice made by seamen in both wars to a new audience."

The Merchant Navy, known as the Mercantile Marine in the First World War, played a crucial role in both wars by keeping Britain and its allies supplied with food and materials, and by transporting soldiers to theatres of war and taking the sick and wounded home.

Just to remind you these QR plaques are also available at our memorials in Cardiff Bay and Barry.

#### **NEW MERCHANT NAVY MEDAL FOR MERITORIOUS SERVICE**

Back in 2011 the Merchant Navy Medal Fund Committee began a campaign for a medal that is granted a place in the order of wear.

Two years ago, Her Majesty the Queen approved a recommendation to introduce such a medal - a state award with a place in the order of wear, and earlier this year, the Royal Warrant was signed.

Throughout this period, the Merchant Navy Medal Fund Committee worked closely with the Department for Transport and although it has taken some time to get to this point; these things are never as straightforward as they appear.

I am delighted to announce today that from 2016 we will have a new state award for a Merchant Navy Medal for Meritorious Service with a place in the order of wear. The first awards will be announced on Merchant Navy Day – 3rd September 2016.

May I take this opportunity to thank the Merchant Navy Medal Fund Committee for the work they have done in recognising the outstanding service of those who have been awarded Merchant Navy Medals over the past 10 years. Nominations for the first awards of the new Medal for Meritorious Service will open today.

Eligibility for the Medal is limited to those who have served, or are serving, in the Merchant Navy or Fishing Fleets of the U.K., Isle of Man and the Channel Islands who have shown devotion to duty and exemplary service which has been of particular value and has constituted an outstanding example to others. Recipients of the Medal will normally be required to have completed 20 year's good conduct and exemplary service, although in exceptional circumstance the period of service may be less.
