SERVICE OF REMEMBRANCE NOVEMBER 2020




The Coronavirus has taken it's toll on our meetings and events since April 2020. As you are aware all our general meetings have been cancelled until further notice along with our

MEMBERS WHO HAVE CROSSED THE BAR SINCE THE LAST NEWSLETTER

COMMODORE OLIVER J. T. LINDSAY

Our President and shipmate Commodore Oliver Lindsay Crossed the Bar at 0200 on

Wednesday 23rd September 2020 at the age of 95. Oliver was one of the founder members of the Merchant Navy Association (Wales) and our first Chairman in July 1995. He was appointed President of the Association in 2000 and was also President of the South Wales Branch of the Russian Convoy Club. In May 1941 Oliver sailed as an apprentice with the Reardon Smith Line of Cardiff. His ship, S.S. Botavon, was sunk en route to Murmansk on the 2nd May 1942. He was one of the survivors and was taken to a transit camp where he remained until July 1942. He was promoted to Second Mate in November 1944, First Mate in 1950, Master in



1962, and was appointed Commodore of the Reardon Smith Line in 1981. He completed a total of 54 years in the service of the British Maritime Industry.

MR. RICHARD JAMES

Richard Crossed the Bar on 1st July 2020 at the age of 78. He served at sea for 37 years



in the engineering department between September 1962 and October 1999 rising through the ranks to Chief Engineer. His first ship being S.S. Zenatia and his last U.K.D Dolphin. Besides being a member of the Barry Branch he was a very active member of the Royal British Legion in Penarth, and the Mayor of Penarth Cllr. Mark Wilson and the Penarth Town Council asked for the flags at the Council HQ at West House to be flown at half-mast in tribute to Richard in honour and

respect of his devotion to the Legion and the community of Penarth.

I have also received late notification of the passing of Graham Leonard of Cardiff in February 2020 at the age of 84, and D.G. McLean of Caerwent, in April 2020.

HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL DAY WALES 2021


No invitations this year but a pre-recorded 'virtual' ceremony will be filmed for members of the public to view safely in their own homes on the Cardiff Council YouTube channel.
