THE BATTLE OF THE ATLANTIC 70TH ANNIVERSARY





Our service on 18th May was dedicated to the Commemoration of the 70th Anniversary of the Battle of the Atlantic. Invitations extended beyond local dignitaries and maritime representatives to cover all those who participated in what was the longest battle of the Second World War. There was an extremely good turn out as the photo above shows - the first time we have had a "full house" of wreaths on the memorial. Seventeen standards were on parade with representatives from as far afield as North Somerset and Swansea. The NAW gave us free use of the Pierhead building for refreshments, which were provided by Cardiff Council. Many thanks to all who supported the event.

Armed Forces Day - Cardiff

Armed Forces Day 2013 was held on Saturday 29th May at Coopers Field, Cardiff. In recognition of the Year of the Convoy and the 70th Anniversary of the Battle of the Atlantic our (MN) standard lead the parade of Veterans and, for what I believe is the first time ever, was presented at the Drumhead Service. Unfortunately Tony Meade was unable to attend due to ill health so John Mumford stepped in at the last minute and did a fine job. We had our



own "stall" at the event and were privileged to be visited by the Lord Lieutenant of South Glamorgan Dr. Peter Beck and his wife Lyn, the First Sea Lord Admiral Sir George Zambellas, Commodore Jamie Miller, Naval Regional Commander (Wales and Western England) and the new Lord Mayor of Cardiff, amongst others. Went the day well.





Arctic Star/Ushakov Medal



On Wednesday 19th December 2012 veterans of the Arctic Convoys were finally recognised, 67 years after the end of World War Two, when the Prime Minister announced in the House of Commons that an Arctic Star medal will be awarded. On Tuesday 19th March 2013, two of our members, Oliver Lindsay and Con Connelly, were invited to 10, Downing Street to receive the medals from the Prime Minister. If there are other veterans who qualify and have not received their medals please let me know.

It has also been decide to accept the award of the Ushakov Medal issued by The Russian Government to the veterans of the Arctic Convoys. On the 16th June the British Prime Minister and Russian

President Vladimir Putin presented a number of veterans with the medal at a special ceremony at Downing Street.

All British veterans that played a role in the World War Two Arctic Convoys are eligible to receive the Ushakov Medal. For those who have sadly passed away, the Medals will be made available to widows or their next of kin, although there may be a delay in this, given that priority is given to existing Veterans.

Please note that the medal is only available to those that took part in missions to the Soviet Union – those who's missions went to other destinations such as Iceland are unfortunately not eligible.

We are still awaiting confirmation of the exact process by which applications can be made and will update this page when we have these details. The decision to award the Ushakov Medal rests with the Russian Authorities, not the British Government.



When writing to the Russian Embassy (address below) regarding eligibility it is vital to provide information such as the dates of service and names of ships to make assessment easier.
